Context of the research activity		
Motivation and objectives of the research in this field	Understanding the dynamics of the ultrafast energy and charge flow in pure liquid water is essential for obtaining insights into the role of water in chemical reactions and biologically-relevant processes occurring in aqueous environments. Charge migration can occur on an extremely fast time scale, ranging from a few tens of attoseconds to a few femtoseconds. This process has been recently investigated using attosecond light sources in biochemically relevant molecules in the gas phase. These pioneering works have paved the way for the possibility ofcontrolling bond formation and bond breaking via a coherent electron excitation, however, a characterization of charge migration in a realistic environment (i.e. water) is still missing. The main goal of the present PhD project is to investigate the ultrafast dynamics and charge transfer processes in liquid water and solvated molecules through ultrafast time-resolved spectroscopy experiments. This research topic is developed in the framework of the participation of CNR to the Center for Molecular Water Science at DESY (Germany).	
Methods and techniques that will be developed and used to carry out the research	<ul> <li>time-resolved transient absorption in a thin flat liquid jet using few-fs visible and UV pulses;</li> <li>Investigation of solvated electron dynamics in water and water solution containing biologically relevant molecules by ultrafast THz spectroscopy;</li> <li>Development of a high-intensity off-resonant (&lt; 1 THz) THz-pump.</li> </ul>
