Context of the research activity	
Motivation and objectives of the research in this field	The research will take place between Milan, where the 'Renzo Piano Laboratory' will be set up at the ABC Dept., Genova, and Paris, where the Renzo Piano Foundation (RPF) archives and the studio are located. With the task of preserving and making usable the heritage of drawings, sketches, documents and models that bear witness to more than fifty years of work, the project aims to promote interdisciplinarity, involvement in international research networks and intersectorality. As part of a broader collaboration with the Politecnico di Milano, the involvement of a major research center such as the RPF ensures the quality of the candidate's academic training in the field of cultural heritage, with a focus in its management and enhancement. Regarding the areas of intervention of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR) provided by Article 3 of Regulation (EU) 2021/241, the project proposal meets the programmatic directions of some of the main horizontal pillars of the PNRR-Next Generation Italy. The research program affects the areas of digital transformation, innovation and competitiveness in culture and tourism (mission 1 - C2 and C3), development and innovation in scientific research and education (mission 4). 	3. 'TO BE' analysis and identification of the enhancement strategy
	In this second phase we set ourselves the goal of defining together with the RPF the valorization strategy for the archive, considering the strategic lines as a whole.
Methods and techniques that will be developed and used to carry out the research	The research group a of Architectural History in the ABC Department deals with 20th century history with a special focus on the archives of contemporary architects. From this synergy between academic and archival contexts, the candidate will be able to work through the research methods of architectural history in a challenging and international environment.



	The research project involves a 6-month research period abroad, to be held at the Renzo Piano Building Workshop headquarters in Paris. The research also aims to bring into dialogue historical research, the memory of the RPF's archives and innovative methods for rational management of the archival heritage and its enhancement. For this reason, the project includes 6 additional months to be spent in Genoa, at the research center and archive of the RPF, where the candidate will have the opportunity to deal with aspects related to the architectural archive and the management of the RPF's cultural events (publications/exhibitions/curatorships).
	Archive consistencies and study materials The archives consist of the main fond relating to the projects of the years 1960-1999 and the fonds of the projects closed by the year 2015. Currently, considering all this material, there are more than 5,000 models and maquettes, some 100,000 sketches and paper drawings, over 1,500 linear meters of documentation and over 12 terabytes of digital documentation recorded in the archive. The survey of the photographic collection estimated that there are approximately 500,000 traditional supports (slides, plates, prints, rolls, negatives) relating to the 1960-1999 Projects Fond. Through the study of these materials, the aim of the research is to investigate not only the story of each project, but also the Renzo Piano Building Workshop's distinctive working method.
Educational objectives	Educational goals are to develop and learn historical research methodologies and understand projects from a historical perspective, developing research skills in international and multidisciplinary teams.
Job opportunities	Job and career opportunities include professional outlets in all sectors, public and private, having to do with historical research in architectural history, as well as employment in museums, archives, research foundations or architectural firms engaged in the historical
