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Motivation and objectives of the research in this field	The research will address a pressing debate in relation to organizing innovation in business organizations, with a specific focus on organizational and industry context characterized by profound transformations. The PhD project will build on existing literature and develop new theoretical insights concerniong the organization of corporate innovation initiatives, and the change-management processes involved in building a structured approach to innovation. In doing so, the research will inform theory and practice to boost the innovation capacity and performance of business organizations, enabling innovation business transformation in fast-changing competitive contexts such as the energy sector.	
Methods and techniques that will be developed and used to carry out the research	The research will apply rigorous methods as established in the international research community and relevant literature on innovation management. The methods will center around qualitative methodologies such as in-depth multiple case studies with data collected from interviews, archies and real-time observations. Also, the research will rely on structured survey studies in order to provide the grounds for empirical generalizability of the findings. Finally, the research will explore elements of action research, applying the emergent insights from the field study to the hosting company, while also drawing from it original insights about the processes and practices entailed in re-organizing for innovation.
